The Parliamentary Constituencies (Scotland) (West Fife and Dunfermline Burghs) Order, 1960

Laid before Parliament in draft

Made - - - - - 16th March, 1960
Coming into Operation 30th March, 1960

At the Court at Buckingham Palace, the 16th day of March, 1960

Present,

The Queen's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

Whereas under subsection (3) of section 2 of the House of Commons (Redistribution of Seats) Act, 1949(a), the Boundary Commission for Scotland have submitted to the Secretary of State a report dated the ninth day of January, 1960, with respect to the areas comprised in certain constituencies in Scotland and showing the constituencies into which they recommend, in accordance with the provisions of the House of Commons (Redistribution of Seats) Acts, 1949 and 1958, that the areas should be divided:

And Whereas the Secretary of State has laid the said report before Parliament together with the draft of this Order in Council for giving effect to the recommendations contained in the report and each House of Parliament has by resolution approved the said draft:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, in exercise of the powers conferred by subsection (6) of section 3 of the House of Commons (Redistribution of Seats) Act, 1949, and of all other powers enabling Her in that behalf, is pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. In lieu of the county constituency of West Fife and the burgh constituency of Dunfermline Burghs described in the First Schedule to the Representation of the People Act, 1948(b), as read, in regard to West Fife, with the House of Commons (Redistribution of Seats) (Scotland) (West Fife and Kirkcaldy Burghs) Order, 1953(c), and which are specified in Part

I of the Schedule to this Order, there shall be substituted the county constituency and burgh constituency specified in Part II of the Schedule to this Order.

2. The electoral registration officer for the county of Fife shall make such re-arrangement of the register of Parliamentary electors as may be necessary to give effect to this Order.

3.—(1) This Order may be cited as the Parliamentary Constituencies (Scotland) (West Fife and Dunfermline Burghs) Order, 1960.

(2) The Interpretation Act, 1889(a), shall apply to the interpretation of this Order as it applies to the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.

(3) This Order shall come into force on the fourteenth day after the day on which it is made.

Provided that the coming into force of this Order shall not affect any Parliamentary election until a proclamation is issued by Her Majesty summoning a new Parliament, or affect the constitution of the House of Commons until the dissolution of the Parliament in being on the day on which this Order comes into operation.
