2018 Review: Meeting with political parties

For discussion

Background

1. As with the 6th Review, the Commission agreed to offer a briefing on the 2018 Review of UK Parliament constituencies to political parties. The Secretariat invited parties represented on the Electoral Commission's Scottish Parliament Political Parties Panel and all indicated that a briefing would be helpful. The meeting has been arranged for afternoon of 16 May.

Issues

- 2. By way of background information, all parties have been sent a copy of the draft policies and procedures booklet and been invited to consider any questions they might have and if possible submit these in advance.
- 3. The Secretariat proposes to provide attendees with a general handout on the 2018 Review and a copy of the map showing theoretical constituency entitlement by council area. These are at Appendices A and B.
- 4. In terms of meeting handling, the Secretariat proposes that the Secretary talk through the issues highlighted in the handout and that parties then have the opportunity to ask any questions of the Commission and feed in views. While no party has yet responded to the request to submit questions in advance, specific issues they are likely to be interested in are:
 - The shared consultation portal and its development
 - The outline timescales for the consultation on initial proposals
 - The arrangements for public hearings including locations
- 5. The parties may ask about plans for training in the use of software and data. As agreed at the April meeting, rather than offer formal training, the Secretariat can provide ad hoc advice and assistance as required.

Conclusion

6. The Commission is invited to agree the proposed approach to the meeting.

Legislative requirements

Parliamentary Constituencies Act 1986 as amended:

600 constituencies in total

4 specified island constituencies, 2 in England, 2 in Scotland

Each constituency must have an electorate that is no less than 95% and no more than 105% of the UK electoral quota

No constituency larger than 13,000 sq.kms

Exception for island constituencies and any constituency larger than 12,000 sq.kms which may have an electorate lower than 95% of the electoral quota if reasonable.

Electoral quota

Use electoral register, including attainers, from 1 December 2015

Electoral quota calculated by dividing total electorate, less electorate of the specified islands, by number of seats to be allocated (596).

UK electoral quota is 74,769.2

Acceptable range for constituency electorate is no less than 71,031 (95%) and no more than 78,507 (105%) of electoral quota
