# 2023 Review of Westminster Constituencies Constituency names and designations

#### **Action required**

1. The Commission is invited to agree the names and designations of the constituencies forming its Initial Proposals which are due for publication for public consultation in October 2021.

#### **Background**

6.

- 2. The Commission has agreed about half of the boundaries of the constituencies which will form its Initial Proposals but only provisional names have been assigned to each constituency. County or burgh designations have not yet been considered for any constituencies.
- 3. The Commission has set out its policies on the naming and designation of constituencies in its Policies and Procedures booklet for the Review, which is reproduced at Appendix A.
- 4. This paper draws together the provisional names for all constituencies within each council area. It suggests possible alternative names and provides the Scottish Parliament constituency names in each area, (see Appendix B). For each constituency an asterisk in the column headed "Pt" indicates that the constituency is only *partly* within that council area.
- 5. For considering a burgh or county designation for each constituency, the areas of the proposed constituencies are listed in Appendix C.
- 7. The areas and designations of the existing constituencies are listed in Appendix D.
- 8. There is no record of how the Commission recommended the designations for the existing constituencies. The Commission's Fifth Periodical Report of the Boundary Commission for Scotland stated "With the exception of constituencies contained wholly within city authorities, all but a very few of the recommended constituencies had a significant non-urban electorate so we decided that 41 of the 59 constituencies proposed should be designated county constituencies."
- 9. All of the existing burgh constituencies cover an area of 120km² or less with two exceptions: East Dunbartonshire county constituency (85km²) and Dundee East burgh constituency (157km²).
- 10. Maps of the agreed constituencies are at Appendix E.
- 11. A map of historical county names with existing council area boundaries is at Appendix F.
- 12. The Commission published an Information Paper in February 2011 listing and indexing past constituency names. That Information Paper is not included as part of this paper, but is available on the Commission's website, <a href="www.bcomm-scotland.independent.gov.uk/sites/default/files/Constituency\_names\_since\_1950.pdf">www.bcomm-scotland.independent.gov.uk/sites/default/files/Constituency\_names\_since\_1950.pdf</a>

- 13. Boundaries Scotland considered its naming policy ahead of its Second Review of Scottish Parliament Boundaries at its meetings of 21 July 2020 (Paper 2530) and 12 October 2020 (Paper 2538). Boundaries Scotland agreed the following criteria:
  - have regard to the BCS policy on naming UK Parliament constituencies;
  - in order to minimise voter confusion, names of Scottish Parliament constituencies should in general differ from those of UK Parliament constituencies, where an appropriate and distinct alternative is available;
  - constituency names should reflect their geographic extents but, where possible, be short and should not attempt to describe an area exhaustively; and
  - consistency with historical names is important where a constituency is recognisably similar.

#### Recommendation

14. The Commission is invited to agree names and designations for its Initial Proposal constituencies


#### Naming and designation of constituencies


As part of a review, we recommend a name for each constituency, and have developed a set of guidelines when proposing names for constituencies:


- to use an existing constituency name where there is a successor constituency that is recognisably similar;
- to prefer constituency names that are short rather than attempt to describe an area exhaustively;
- to ensure that names of UK Parliament constituencies in general differ from those of Scottish Parliament constituencies where an appropriate and distinct alternative is available. Relying on word order alone (e.g. 'Glasgow East' and 'East Glasgow') or conjunctions (e.g. 'North and East Fife' and 'North East Fife') is generally not a sufficient difference;
- not to place compass points at the beginning of a name, in order to help make an alphabetically sorted list easier to use. We make an exception if a constituency is named after a council area or town which has a compass point at the start of its name (such as East Lothian or East Kilbride);
- to use 'South West' rather than 'Southwest'; and
- not to use the same name for a constituency and a council area unless the two are coterminous.


We take account of local views when recommending names for constituencies, and also encourage local authorities to submit suggestions to us.


We are required to designate each constituency as either a burgh or a county constituency, but the legislation does not define these terms. We consider that constituencies comprising predominantly urban areas will normally be designated as burgh constituencies, and constituencies which are predominantly rural will normally be designated as county constituencies. The designation affects the expenses allowable at elections.












