Minutes of previous meeting

1. The Commission approved the minutes of the meeting on 6 June 2022 with minor amendments.

Matters Arising

- 2. The Secretary advised the Commission that she had had discussions with the Office of the Secretary of State for Scotland regarding holding public hearings in a hybrid format in future reviews. They have no immediate plans to seek to have legislation changed to allow this as the next Review is not scheduled to report until 2031. The Commission suggested that the use of hybrid public hearings can be a recommendation for future reviews and published in the 2023 Review Final Report.
- 3. The Secretary advised the Commission that she is shortly due to meet the Office of the Secretary of State for Scotland (OSSS) to discuss the upcoming audit of OSSS's sponsorship of the Commission, and will also discuss hybrid public hearings with them then.

Business Update

4. The was no business not covered under other headings in the meeting.

2023 Review: Consideration of Revised Proposals - Angus, Clackmannanshire, Dundee City, Falkirk, Fife, Perth and Kinross, Stirling and West Lothian council areas (Paper 2022/19)

5. The Commission considered Paper 2022/19, having previously considered Paper 2022/11 on this council area grouping at its meeting of 9 May 2022, where it provisionally adopted suggestions received for West Lothian which would place Broxburn and Uphall in a Livingston constituency and Whitburn and Blackburn in a Bathgate-Linlithgow constituency because these better reflected historical local ties. At that meeting the Commission also considered draft designs for Clackmannanshire, Fife, Perth and Kinross and Stirling council areas, based on the assumption that Falkirk / West Lothian and Angus / Dundee could be added to neighbouring council area groupings.

- 6. The Commission considered the options presented in the paper. The Commission considered that Option 1 would be likely to break local ties by including Bishopbriggs in a constituency with part of Glasgow. The Commission gave weight to Option 2A and Option 2B's disadvantages including the division of Stirling council area between constituencies, and that neither addressed the objections to Carse of Gowrie being included in a Dundee constituency rather than a Perthshire constituency. The Commission preferred Option 3, noting that it avoided dividing Stirling council area between constituencies, and included Carse of Gowrie in a Perthshire constituency rather than in a constituency with Dundee.
- 7. The Commission asked the Secretariat to examine options that could improve the shape of the Perth and Tay constituency in Option 3, shown in Appendix D by Auchterarder and Coupar Angus.
- 8. The Commission asked the Secretariat to develop a revised Option 3 and share this by email for consideration and agreement.

2023 Review: Consideration of Revised Proposals - Constituency Names (Paper 2022/20)

- 9. The Commission considered Paper 2022/20, having agreed at its previous meetings to decide the names for the constituencies in its Revised Proposals once the constituency boundaries had all been agreed.
- 10. The Commission considered all the responses it had received with respect to names of constituencies in its public consultations, as well as its guidelines for constituency names contained in Appendix A.
- 11. The Commission agreed to use the following constituency names in its Revised Proposals:
