- 1. We, the Boundary Commission for Scotland, are constituted by the Parliamentary Constituencies Act 1986. We submit this supplementary report on certain European Parliamentary constituencies in Scotland in accordance with paragraph 3 of Schedule 2 to the European Parliamentary Elections Act 1978, as amended by the European Parliamentary Elections Act 1981, the Parliamentary Constituencies Act 1986 and the European Communities (Amendment) Act 1986. Paragraph 3 of Schedule 2 to the 1978 Act, as amended, requires us to proceed with a review of, and submit a report on, any European Parliamentary constituency (EPC) which no longer complies with paragraph 9 of Schedule 2 as a result of the making of an Order in Council giving effect to recommendations for the alteration of parliamentary constituencies contained in a report submitted to you by us under section 3(3) of the Parliamentary Constituencies Act 1986. Paragraph 9 of Schedule 2 to the 1978 Act states that each EPC shall consist of 2 or more whole parliamentary constituencies. This report describes the review and contains our recommendations for alterations to 6 of the 8 EPCs in Scotland.
- 2. The present EPCs were created by the European Parliamentary Constituencies (Scotland) Order 1984 which came into operation on 11 April 1984. Changes in parliamentary constituencies since the creation of the present EPCs result from the Parliamentary Constituencies (Scotland) (Miscellaneous Changes) Orders 1987 and 1988 which came into force on 1 April 1987 and 14 November 1988, respectively.
- 3. The boundaries of the following 6 EPCs in Scotland are affected:

Mid Scotland and Fife Lothians

Strathclyde East Strathclyde West

South of Scotland

Glasgow

The boundaries of Highlands and Islands EPC and North East Scotland EPC have not been affected by changes in parliamentary constituencies and accordingly these EPCs were not included in our review.

4. Notice of our intention to consider making a report with respect to these 6 EPCs was submitted to you on 15 November 1988 and was published in the *Edinburgh Gazette* on 18 November 1988. Our recommendations are based on the number of electors on the electoral register on the latter date. We issued our provisional recommendations on 18 November 1988 and, as required by the 1978 Act, we published these in newspapers circulating in the EPCs affected, inviting any persons who wished to do so to make representations within the statutory period of one month. Copies of the recommendations, with illustrative maps, were made available for public inspection in at least one local authority office or public library in each parliamentary constituency within each EPC. The addresses of the premises where the documents could be inspected were included in the press notice. We are grateful to the local authorities and their officers for their cooperation in these arrangements. In addition, copies of the recommendations and maps were sent to the political parties

in Scotland, the Members representing the 6 EPCs included in the review and the Members of Parliament for the constituencies affected. Copies were deposited in the Library of the House of Commons and the Library of the House of Lords for inspection there.

- 5. In each case our recommendation was for the change required to remove the anomaly between the parliamentary constituency boundary and the EPC boundary. The considerations which led to our proposals are set out below. The Parliamentary Constituencies (Scotland) (Miscellaneous Changes) Orders 1987 and 1988 alter parliamentary constituency boundaries with consequential effects on EPC boundaries as follows:
 - 5.1 The alteration of the parliamentary constituency boundary in the vicinity of Croftamie village transfers an area of some 1,500 acres from Dumbarton CC to Stirling CC and affects the boundary between Strathclyde West EPC and Mid Scotland and Fife EPC. The effect of our provisional recommendation is to transfer that area from Strathclyde West EPC to Mid Scotland and Fife EPC and, as a consequence, to transfer 211 electors from Strathclyde West EPC to Mid Scotland and Fife EPC.
 - 5.2 The alteration of the parliamentary constituency boundary at Spectacle E'e Falls, Sandford, transfers an area of 1.8 acres from Clydesdale CC to East Kilbride CC and affects the boundary between South of Scotland EPC and Strathclyde East EPC. The effect of our provisional recommendation is to transfer that area from South of Scotland EPC to Strathclyde East EPC. No electors are involved.
 - 5.3 The alterations to the parliamentary constituency boundary at Carmunnock transfer 2 areas extending to about 67 acres from East Kilbride CC to Glasgow Cathcart BC and affect the boundary between Strathclyde East EPC and Glasgow EPC. The effect of our provisional recommendation is to transfer those areas from Strathclyde East EPC to Glasgow EPC and, as a consequence, to transfer 8 electors from Strathclyde East EPC to Glasgow EPC.
 - 5.4 The alteration of the parliamentary constituency boundary at Marldene, by Fala, transfers an area extending to about 300 acres from East Lothian CC to Midlothian CC and affects the boundary between South of Scotland EPC and Lothians EPC. The effect of our provisional recommendation is to transfer that area from South of Scotland EPC to Lothians EPC and, as a consequence, to transfer 4 electors from South of Scotland EPC to Lothians EPC.
 - 5.5 The alteration of the parliamentary constituency boundary at Newhailes transfers an area of about 6 acres from Edinburgh East BC to East Lothian CC and affects the boundary between Lothians EPC and South of Scotland EPC. The effect of our provisional recommendation is to transfer that area from Lothians EPC to South of Scotland EPC and, as a consequence, to transfer 6 electors from Lothians EPC to South of Scotland EPC.
 - 5.6 The alteration of the parliamentary constituency boundary at Black Loch transfers an area of about 42 hectares from Monklands East BC to Falkirk East CC and affects the boundary between Strathclyde East EPC and Mid Scotland and Fife EPC. The effect of our provisional recommendation is to transfer that area from Strathclyde East EPC to Mid Scotland and Fife EPC. No electors are involved.
 - 5.7 The alterations to the parliamentary constituency boundary at Easter Balmuildy Farm and Laigh Kenmure Farm transfer 2 areas extending to about 50 acres from Strathkelvin and Bearsden CC to Glasgow Maryhill BC and an area of about 33.5 acres from Glasgow Maryhill BC to Strathkelvin and Bearsden CC, and affect the boundary between Glasgow EPC and Strathclyde West EPC. The effect of our provisional recommendation is to transfer the 2 areas extending to about 50 acres from Strathclyde West EPC to Glasgow EPC and the area of about 33.5 acres from Glasgow EPC to Strathclyde West EPC and, as a consequence, to transfer one elector from Glasgow EPC to Strathclyde West EPC and 2 electors from Strathclyde West EPC to Glasgow EPC.

- 5.8 The alterations to the parliamentary constituency boundary at Yoker transfer 5 areas from Clydebank and Milngavie CC to Glasgow Garscadden BC and 4 areas from Glasgow Garscadden BC to Clydebank and Milngavie CC, and affect the boundary between Strathclyde West EPC and Glasgow EPC. The effect of our provisional recommendation is to transfer those 5 areas, which contain no electors, from Strathclyde West EPC to Glasgow EPC and those 4 areas from Glasgow EPC to Strathclyde West EPC and, as a consequence, to transfer 103 electors from Glasgow EPC to Strathclyde West EPC.
- 6. The proposed changes described in paragraph 5 are summarised in the following table:




