UK PARLIAMENT CONSTITUENCIES IN SCOTLAND: 1950 - 1955

UK Parliament constituencies in Scotland: 1950 - 1955

This paper explains the 71 UK Parliament constituencies in Scotland between 1950 and 1955, and their relationship with local government boundaries in Scotland.

These 71 constituencies were as recommended in our Initial Report, submitted in 1947, and implemented by the Representation of the People Act 1948 (c.65). They are made up of 32 burgh constituencies and 39 county constituencies.

A summary of the main rules and their application during the Initial Review were:

- Scotland shall have no less than 71 constituencies.
- 71 constituencies were recommended. Prior to 1950 there were 71 constituencies.
- all constituencies should be as near the electoral quota as practicable. The average electorate for the 71 Scottish constituencies was 49,581, which was considerably below the electoral quota for Great Britain 57,697.
- the Commission may depart from the strict application of electoral parity if special geographical considerations apply. This rule was not applied during the review.

We reported in 1950 and 1951 on Interim Reviews after changes to the boundaries of Clydebank, Johnstone and Kirkcaldy burghs, and recommended consequential amendments to six constituencies. Those changes were implemented by the Parliamentary Constituencies (Scotland) Orders 1951 (SI 1951/756 to 1951/758).

These constituencies were contested in General Elections on 23 February 1950 and (incorporating the amendments) 25 October 1951.

These constituencies were succeeded by the constituencies which we recommended in our First Periodical Report, submitted in 1954.


Each constituency was designated as either a county constituency or a burgh constituency. This designation affects the allowable expenses by candidates during elections.

Appendix A is an alphabetical list of the constituencies and their designations, with a note of which constituencies were amended in 1951.


Appendix B is a list of which constituencies covered each of Scotland's counties.

Appendix A - Constituencies

This Appendix is an alphabetical list of the 32 burgh constituencies and 39 county constituencies. Some of the names of Edinburgh and Glasgow constituencies recommended in the report include a comma: these have been included in this alphabetical list for completeness, but omitted elsewhere for clarity.

In the Initial Report, each constituency was defined in terms of parliamentary counties and parliamentary burghs, and divisions within them. In the Representation of the People Act 1948 which implemented the recommendations, constituency names are used in place of the parliamentary counties, parliamentary burghs and divisions.

Appendix C - County composition of constituencies

This Appendix lists which counties and their constituent parts made up each UK Parliament constituencies. Most counties were made of burghs and districts, although a few small counties did not contain any districts. The city counties of Aberdeen, Dundee, Edinburgh and Glasgow were made up of wards.

The boundaries of the counties, burghs and wards are as they existed on 31 October 1947. In the cases of the Edinburgh and Glasgow constituencies, the wards used to define the constituencies were introduced later: by SI 1948/876 for Glasgow and by SI 1948/1138 for Edinburgh. The constituency definitions were amended in 1951 to reflect later amendments to the boundaries of Clydebank, Johnstone and Kirkcaldy burghs.

Constituencies were made up of whole burghs, and generally whole districts and wards. Where only part of a district or ward was included in a constituency, this is indicated in the table.
