UK PARLIAMENT CONSTITUENCIES IN SCOTLAND: 2005 - 2024

UK Parliament constituencies in Scotland: 2005 -2024

This paper explains the 59 UK Parliament constituencies in Scotland from 2005 to 2024, and their relationship with local government boundaries in Scotland.

These constituencies resulted from our Fifth Periodical Report which was published in November 2004. The recommendations of the report were enacted by the Parliamentary Constituencies (Scotland) Order 2005 (SI 2005/250).

A summary of the main rules and their application during the Fifth Review were:

- no minimum number of constituencies in Scotland.
- all constituencies should be as near the electoral quota as practicable. The electorate quota was based on the quota for England. This was 69,934. As a consequence this had a significant impact on the number of recommended constituencies which was 59.
- the Commission may depart from the strict application of electoral parity if special geographical considerations apply. According to the report this rule was not applied, although a: Western Isles constituency, renamed Na h-Eileanan an Iar, with 21,884 electors; Ross, Skye and Lochaber constituency with 49,544 electors; and Caithness, Sutherland and Easter Ross constituency with 46,533 electors were recommended. All other constituencies were within a range of 62,214 and 78,675 electors, within 15% of the electorate quota.
- regard shall be had to the boundaries of local authority areas.
- Orkney and Shetland was designated a reserved constituency and out-with the review.


These constituencies were contested in General Elections on 5 May 2005, 6 May 2010, 7 May 2015, 8 June 2017 and 12 December 2019.

Each constituency is designated as either a county constituency or a burgh constituency. These designations affect the allowable expenses by candidates during elections.



³ The boundary between Glasgow City and North Lanarkshire council areas at Cardowan was amended from 1 April 2010 (SI2009/368) and again from 1 April 2019 (SI2018/308) after boundary reviews by the Local Government Boundary Commission for Scotland. As a result of these reviews, a minor part of Glasgow East constituency was in North Lanarkshire council area, and a minor part of Coatbridge, Chryston and Bellshill constituency was in Glasgow City council area.
